

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH ARTICLE 39.14

Comes now the defendant and hereby acknowledges that I am satisfied with the receipt of the items recorded in the Discovery Compliance Statement. I further withdraw any unfulfilled requests for discovery items listed under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure Article 39.14, other than to the State's continuing duty under Article 39.14(k), the United States Constitution, and the Texas Constitution, to provide exculpatory, impeachment, or mitigation evidence tending to negate the defendant's guilt or tending to reduce his punishment for the charged offense. My attorney has fully and completely explained to me my right to request further discovery pursuant to Article 39.14, and I understand that right. I am forgoing any additional discovery in order to enter into a plea, and I am making that decision of my own volition because I believe it is in my best interests to enter into the plea after receiving the full advice of counsel and explanation of my rights.
